**About Our District:** The mission of the Pikeville Independent School District is to provide a rigorous, relevant education in a positive, nurturing environment to develop each student as a lifelong learner and responsible citizen in a global community. All stakeholders strive to provide visionary leadership, sound fiscal management, high expectations, and quality instruction in a safe, orderly, and positive learning environment. Both Pikeville Elementary and Pikeville High School are accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. The mission is supported by a curriculum that includes technical, academic, and personal skills necessary for lifelong learning and a variety of extracurricular activities to address students' physical, social, emotional, and spiritual needs. For nearly a century, Pikeville Independent has provided the Pikeville community with institutions of learning that consistently rank among the top in Kentucky.

**How We Ensure Educational Equity:** Pikeville Elementary is focusing on instruction that accommodates diverse learner needs and is based on both formal and informal assessment data. Development of a Response to Intervention (RTI) system, expansion of the Gifted and Talented program and daytime Extended School Services aid PES in targeting the needs all students. Pikeville High School is continually monitoring course offerings to ensure the best educational opportunities for all students. Students are offered a comprehensive range of curriculum options including Advanced Placement, dual credit, and Career and Technical courses. PHS also offers Extended School Services with tutoring available for all students, as well as Junior High math and reading lab classes to assist at-risk students. Both schools recognize the importance of parent involvement and use the services of the Pikeville Family Resource and Youth Service Center to remove barriers to student achievement.

# How We Are Doing

Kentucky's Interim School Testing and Accountability System has three parts: the Kentucky Core Content Tests (KCCT); readiness tests by grade level; and other measures of a school's performance, including attendance, retention and dropout rates. This interim system will be replaced in the 2011-12 school year by a new testing and accountability system structured as required by statute. The goal is that, by 2014, nearly all students will score proficient or distinguished in every subject area tested.
